My friend, Gareld Duane Rollins is under consideration for parole. I have known Duane most of his life. He was in the youth group at church which my wife and I led when he was in highschool. I am well acquainted with the family and all circumstances concerning Duane's crimes. He is a gentle person who has never done any physical violence to anyone, but one who has made some very serious mistakes.

I am very excited about the possibility of Duane's parole. I am now retired after twenty-three years in the Judiciary (nine years on the 133rd District Court and fourteen years on the 14th Court of Appeals). I am a limited partner in the law firm, Woodfill & Pressler. We have a number of associates. I have a great need for someone to handle personal matters for me and work directly with me. I have offered the job to Duane and he has accepted it to start when he is released. This job would provide him time to finish his college education. I would be personally involved in every bit of Duane's life with supervision and control. I have various speaking engagements and would want him to travel with me and drive for me. I also need him to handle miscellaneous matters for me. All of this could be worked around his college schedule.

I urge very strongly his release based upon a thorough knowledge of the individual. I promise to employ him upon release. The employment would be by our law firm, Woodfill & Pressler, L.L.P. Our general partner and manager of the firm has agreed to this employment.
